### Objective

This course is an introduction to econometrics. During the sections I will provide you handouts and we will review difficult concepts and empirical tools as we go over the exercises. This will be very good practice to master the material and get ready for the exams. The section material will be identical across GSIs and will be posted on **bCourses** with the solutions. Along the course we will use **Excel**, **Gretl or Stata**. I strongly recommend you to get any version of Stata and force yourself to learn how to use it. Stata is widely used in Economics and Finance, and hopefully by the end of this course you will be able to add it to your Resume!

Some deviations from this rule are possible if I find them convenient. Note that I won't be able to provide you with exact homework solutions during my office hours, but I will provide some guidance. set in class on the date it is due. Late homeworks will not be accepted. If you are unable to submit your homework on time yourself, try to ask your classmates to do it or send me an e-mail explaining your situation in advance.
